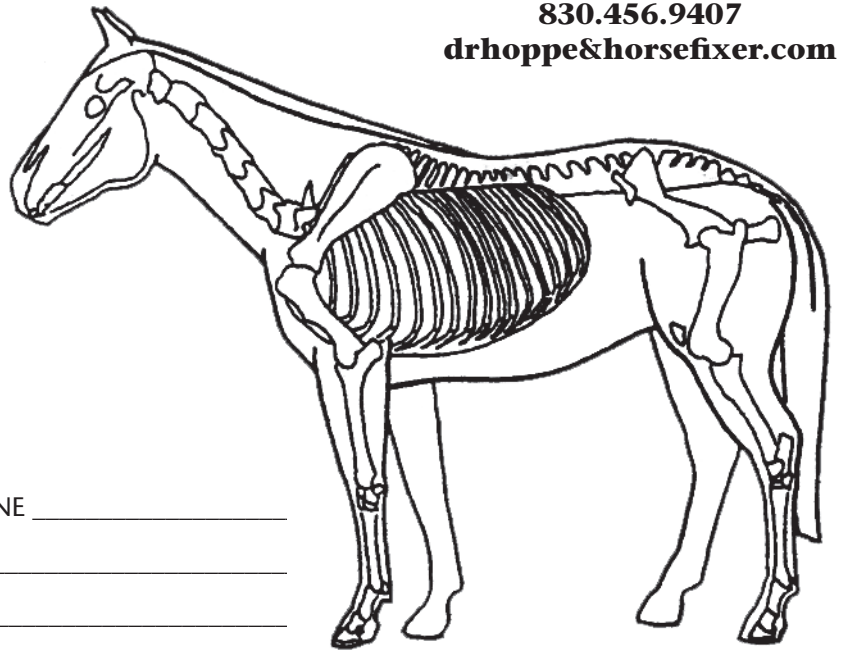

INSTRUCTIONS / NOTES:

What to do after first treatment:

Day 1: Rest and hand walking

Day 2: Lunge horse as follows - 2 min. walk
5 min. trot
reverse direction
5 min. trot
2 min. walk

Day 3: Ride horse under saddle.
"Long and Low" or "Hack" the horse
Ride with this extended trot for no more than 20 min.
Straight line work is preferred to figure 8.

Day 4: Ride as usual. Horse can go back to normal work.

Use common sense when bringing horse back to work. Gradually bringing the horse back is preferred to rapid return to work. Horses should generally be exercised at least every other day to keep them in good muscle.
